AFLC CELEBRATES CHARTER ANNIVERSARY

On Jan. 16, some 40 members of the Austin Founder Lions Club celebrated the 104th anniversary of the club's charter dated Jan. 18, 1916. PID Joe Al Picone of Brenham spoke to the club, sharing some of his memories of now deceased Austin Founder Lions like PDG Bill Raschke, Jake Pickle and Willie Kocurek. At one time, AFLC was part of the District which PID Picone served as District Governor.

Picone reminded Austin Founder Lions of the need to change with the times, noting that younger people have different expectations of club meetings. While service attracts younger people, old songs and dated jokes can be turn-offs.

Picone recognized AFLC's newest member, Meagan Ahmad. He presented her with a President's pin. He encouraged club members to give younger and newer members leadership opportunities in order to maintain the future viability of the club to serve the Austin community.

PDG J.P. Kirksey brought a copy of the club's signed charter for all to see, as well as a plaque recognizing the club as a Founder club.

Picone also discussed the LCI Foundation's Campaign 100, a world-wide capital campaign with a goal of raising \$300 million over three years to empower service to 200 million + people in the areas in which Lions serve, as well as disaster relief and humanitarian needs. He urged Austin Founder Lions to become a model club.

"Having PID Joe Al speak to the club was very special to me," said Ann Ward, club president. Picone and his wife Merle were "good friends with my parents, and my Dad – a 70-year Lion – had great admiration for Joe Al." She added, "To me, Joe Al is Mr. Lions." Picone originally was scheduled to install Ward and the 2019-2020 AFLC Board last June. However, his fall eight days prior to the event resulted in a broken leg, and PDG Gary Sult of Stephenville, another friend of Ward's father and a long-time friend to Picone, substituted.

INDIVIDUAL CLUB MEMBERS SERVE MEALS ON WHEELS


Under normal circumstances, Meals on Wheels of Austin provides around 3,000 meals each week, and Austin Founder Lions Club plays a small part in that process. Four current club members and two former members take turns delivering meals to seniors and adults with disabilities. AFLC is responsible for two routes every Monday, and club members have been doing this since 2011. Meals are picked up at MOW's central office located at 3227 E. 5th

Street, and the delivery process takes about one hour. Each Lion delivers about 24 meals per week.

Lions currently on the delivery roster include Gaylord Armstrong, Kathryn Gonzalez (former Lion who continues to deliver), Mark Johnson (former Lion who continues to deliver), Leonor Marques, Drew Scheberle and Robert Watson. The late Gus Garcia also participated in this activity.



moving to Austin where he teaches all levels of tap dance at TexARTS




CLUB ACTIVITIES REACH SPANISH-SPEAKING AUDIENCE
