EYES ON DECK: UPCOMING VISION SCREENINGS

Austin Founder Lions work with the Austin Independent School District to conduct vision screening among pre-kindergarten three- and four-year-old children. Detecting vision problems early helps the child learn better and has a life-long impact. If detected early, Amblyopia or "lazy eye" can usually be corrected completely.
